

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT ADDITIONAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS CRITERIA

The 90/30 degree plan in Emergency Management offers a unique opportunity that combines your past educational, training and certification experience with a quality educational program.

If you can respond affirmatively to one or more of the criteria noted below you will have satisfied the additional admission requirements for the 90-30 program in Emergency Management. Please make sure to inform your admissions counselor and/or advisor.

1. Fifteen (15) units of community college or university coursework from a regionally accredited institution in one or more of the following areas:
 - Law Enforcement/Administration of Justice/Criminal Justice or related disciplines
 - Fire Science or related discipline
 - EMT/EMS or related discipline

2. Certification of completion for a training academy in one or more of the following:
 - Law Enforcement/Administration of Justice/Criminal Justice or related disciplines
 - Fire Science or related discipline
 - EMT/EMS or related discipline
 - FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency)
 - CDP (Center for Domestic Preparedness)
 - NFA (National Fire Academy)
 - EMI (Emergency Management Institute)
 - Other related

3. Professional Development Courses/Training in one or more of the following:
 - Law Enforcement/Administration of Justice/Criminal Justice or related disciplines
 - Fire Science or related discipline
 - EMT/EMS or related discipline
 - FEMA (Note: FEMA offers free online independent study courses that can be taken at any time. Completion of at least one FEMA free online independent study course qualifies to meet this criterion. See below for more information and URLs.*)
 - CDP
 - NFA
 - EMI
 - First Responder
 - Other related

4. Professional experience in one or more of the following areas:
 - EMT
 - Emergency Services
 - Corrections
 - Homeland Security
 - Military
 - Medical or other first responder
 - Law Enforcement
 - Other related
